BRN Report Details Important Changes in Nursing Education

The recently released Board of Registered Nursing 2014-2015 Annual School Report reveals some significant shifts within California schools of nursing. For the first time in decades, there are more students graduating from BSN and Entry Level Masters (ELM) programs than Associate Degree (ADN) programs. In 2015, 5,542 students graduated from ADN programs and 5,577 students graduated from BSN and ELM programs in the state. Six years ago 66.8% of all graduates were completing ADN programs. Read more.

Addressing Specialty RN Workforce Needs in SoCal

Last spring, the Hospital Association of Southern California (HASC) established a workgroup to address a regional shortage of experienced specialty nurses. HealthImpact facilitated a four-month process to determine root causes and recommend innovative regional strategies to resolve those issues.

The workgroup focused on the shortage in seven priority areas: Perioperative, Critical Care, Emergency, Labor & Delivery, Neonatal ICU, Case Manager, and Care Coordinator. They recommended hospitals and nursing schools work together to implement the education programs needed to prepare more nurses with knowledge and experience for these specialty roles. **Want to get involved?** Read more.
