Conference Theme:

We seek to highlight paradigm-shifting strategies that reimagine how nurses are educated, prepared for practice, and supported across academia and practice.

Abstract Focus Categories

We are seeking abstracts that incorporate the latest neuroscience of learning and/or andragogy (adult learning principles). Poster submissions should align with a **Maximum of Two (2)** of the following thematic categories:

1) **Tanner’s Model of Clinical Judgment**

Implementation of noticing, interpreting, responding, and reflecting in developing clinical reasoning skills; understanding and incorporating blind spots.

2) **Narrowing the Academic–Practice Gap**

Innovative strategies that reduce the divide between classroom learning and clinical readiness.

3) **Alignment with ICONEd Strategic Priorities** **LINK:** <https://iconed.org>

4) **Alignment with Benner Institute’s North Star**

Incorporation of elements including central purpose and goals of clinical education, clinical work role competencies, professional apprenticeships, and paradigm shifts into Nursing Curriculum (Academic or Practice).

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- Abstracts must be 500 words or less.
- Clearly identify the aim, approach, and impact, etc. (See Rubric below).
- Include title, presenter(s) name(s), institution, contact information, and attach CVs.
- All accepted posters must be presented in person at the conference, by a minimum of one author.

Poster Abstract Submission Elements Checklist: EN2026

Use this checklist to ensure your poster abstract submission meets common academic and conference standards. All elements should be included unless otherwise specified by the conference call for abstracts.

Title of the Poster (max words 30)

Concise, descriptive, and free of jargon. Clearly reflects the main focus of the project.

Author(s) Information

Include full names, credentials, institutional affiliations, and contact information for the corresponding author(s), including selection of a primary author. Max of four (4) authors.

Background (max words 75)

Brief context or rationale. Explain why the topic is significant in nursing education.

Purpose (max words 75)

Clearly state the aim, goal, or question your project addresses.

Methods / Approach (max words 100)

Describe methodology, intervention, participants, setting, and any theoretical framework(s).

Results / Outcomes (max words 125)

Summarize findings, expected outcomes, or interim results. Include measurable impacts where applicable.

Discussion / Implications (max words 125)

Discuss interpretation and relevance. Describe how the work advances nursing education, student success, and supports the transformation of nursing education.

Keywords (max words 5)

Include 3–5 keywords to support indexing and relevance.

Funding and Conflict of Interest Disclosures

Acknowledge any funding sources and declare conflicts of interest, if any.

Word Count and Formatting

Ensure abstract falls within the word limit and follows the required structure. 500 Words or less (Title, author info, and key words sections not included in word count).

References

Must include a minimum of two (2) APA scholarly cited references (max of 5) aligning with conference themes.

Review Process

Each abstract is peer-reviewed by at least two reviewers following the provided abstract scoring rubric. Reviews are blinded, and reviewers do not see names of submitters or school/organization affiliations.

Acceptance Notification

Email notification of abstract acceptance will be sent to the primary author only.

The primary author must respond by either accepting or denying the invitation to present the poster by the given acceptance deadline. The primary author's failure to accept the poster presentation invitation, by the acceptance deadline, will automatically disqualify the poster from presentation.

Once the primary author has accepted, Benner Institute will collect additional materials to include a short biography of the primary author and a PDF of the Poster Presentation. Materials will be made available to all conference attendees as part of the conference materials. By accepting, All presenters give permission to Benner Institute for posters to be utilized for conference post-production and future resources.
